

### Detention in numbers

- 40,000+ people on any given day
- 400,000 a year
- Held in a network of 210 local, federal, and forprofit immigration detention facilities across the US.
- Civil detention system
- Break away from good immigrant/ bad immigrant narrative
- Even if criminal charges, serve time twice





### Genesis 21:14-19



So Abraham rose early in the morning, and took bread and a skin of water, and gave it to Hagar, putting it on her shoulder, along with the child, and sent her away. And she departed, and wandered about in the wilderness of Beer-sheba.



## Casa Mariposa Detention Visitation Program: Background



- Began with individuals writing to folks in detention in Eloy and Florence, AZ
- Focus shifted slightly with the question, "Where are the women?"
- By 2014, special permission was granted to visit individuals in Eloy Detention Center once a week on Fridays
- Visitation schedule eventually expanded to Wednesday and Friday mornings.
- Each of those days, 5 visitors can visit five individuals each
- 50 folks a week can receive visits (1,500 individuals are detained daily)





### Breaking the Isolation



- Isolation is the name of the game.
- Letters and visits assure individuals that they are not forgotten, and most importantly, that someone cares about them.
- Funds help us send books, money for phone calls and other commissary items.
- We work with community partners to get as many of these resources to as many folks as possible.
- Post-detention support can offer a needed boost and/or help reunite individuals with their support system.





### **Growth & Opportunity**



- Small program, but growing network of partners, including faith communities
- Consistent leadership needed
- Those previously visited/detained began to take interest in giving back to the program
- How do we take our cues from those directly impacted by detention?





### Navigating Growing Pains



- Moving beyond white savior complex
- Language matters!
- Honesty and humility important
- Lifting up stories not heard





### Moved to Act?



- Great--look for those already organizing!
  - Pay attention to who's making decisions, and how they're made
- How are you being asked to show up?


